A Quick Look at Grants Program Accomplishments


What more could we ask for as FNPS members than to see some of our favorite native plant species finding new homes in the urban landscape? The grants program's goal is just that, and disbursed approximately \$5,867.31 between May 2022 and the present. Thank you to all who have applied! Let's take a quick look at some of these accomplishments.

Who? Public buildings (extension service, libraries, etc.) and owner's associations have been the most frequently funded projects. Volunteers typically complete native plant installations and have ranged from school aged children to retirees!



What? Approximately 97 native plant species have been installed through the Serenoa grants program since May 2022. Project goals for owner's associations usually involve improving water quality and erosion control. Most



6,300 square feet of native plants. Wow!

When? A majority of grant applications are received between September and May. Because the grants program is funded primarily by the spring plant sale in May, the board intends to institute a grant cycle, so proposals can be compared more easily, helping to ensure funds will be spent on high quality proposals.



Where? A majority of grants awarded in the past year were in and around Bradenton, with a small cluster in south Sarasota. As major population centers, these are good locations in terms of native plant exposure, but the board would like to encourage applicants in DeSoto and Hardee counties as well. Do you know a prospective candidate in either of these counties? Please encourage them to apply!

pepper hot sauce and beautyberry jelly. The hot sauce came first because my Capsicum annuum var. glabriusculum has been sweating peppers this past summer and I love hot sauce. It was my first attempt at canning! Bird peppers score high in scovilles, so I used only about an eighth cup of the native, about a cup of home grown sweet red peppers, and a mess o' maters. It turned out to be the perfect level of heat.

The jelly came about because this specimen sticks into my folks' driveway. My first inclination was to cut it back, but then I remembered it was FL Native Plant Month! The process was rather simple, and it has been so much fun. I'd love to make pickles from the native creeping cucumber (Melothria pendula... FNPS.org could use a species profile for this) but the #2 cukes grown at Jessica's made a fine substitute!

Late Fall Gardening Tips

- Keep weeds under control. Check for weeds weekly before they get ahead of you.
- Prune trees and shrubs. Remove crossing branches and those which are growing too near the house or other plants. Be careful not to cut plants back too hard since you will not get much growth this time of year.
- Dead-head the flowers. Remove spent flower stalks. Thin out or split perennials if needed.
- Mulch the beds. Mulch helps suppress weeds and protect the roots from heat and cold while adding organic matter to the soil. We recommend recycled hardwood, pine straw, leaf litter, melaluca (bagged as "Florimulch") and eucalyptus mulch.
