Brooks Armstrong, former Serenoa Board member, is president of People for Protecting Peace River, or 3PR, a non-profit group of citizens who seek the long term preservation of the quality of life and health in the rural and coastal areas of central Florida. 3PR believes that we must end the damage being done to our lands by phosphate strip mining and fertilizer production.
