Thank you to FNPS Serenoa Board Member and Membership Coordinator Elliot Prout for organizing a landscape makeover at Manatee Unitarian Universalist Fellowship (MUUF)! On Saturday, May 20th nine volunteers removed non-native plants and installed fifteen native species that will provide food and shelter for native wildlife (several are larval host plants) and beauty and inspiration for the congregation and visitors to downtown Bradenton. The plants were funded by the FNPS Serenoa grants program. Thank you MUUF for embracing the power of native plants!

### **Breaking news!**

Three different Serenoa chapter members have spotted Atala butterflies on the coontie (Zamia integrifolia) plants in or near their yards in Bradenton. This is so exciting! The Atala butterfly was once thought to be extinct, and it is still rare.

An Atala was seen on a coontie in the MUUF planting project. (see picture above).


